Senior Men

On a day where the water at the docks was the flattest most of the squad had ever seen, I'm pleased to report it was a successful event for the squad.

In the division 1, we had 3 men's 4s racing down the course which was a great sign of the depth in the squad. The four of Olly, Charlie, Mantas and Felix took the win in a time of 10'40". Then came Dulwich and closely following was the for of Chris, Oscar, George and Hunter of which 3 of the rowers are new to the squad. This demonstrates how much of a great addition they'll be this year. Our 3rd four rowed strongly coming 4th and beating most of the other opponents at the docks.

Then came division 2 and the bigger boats (2 in fact!).

This year, Poplar wanted every boat at the start line extra early so after boating we had plenty of time to freeze our toes off and indulge in suitably terrible chat before the off.

Both crews switched on when racing started and the two men's 8's powered down the course. The first of Curlew's 8's came 2nd behind a very good Dulwich School (who on earth invited them to the docks?!). Our 2nd 8 came a respectable 5th in the category, beating local rivals Globe comfortably.

Overall, a good day of racing and lots of optimism for the season ahead. Well done to all!



Senior Women

This Docklands Head, the Women's Squad had one goal: To Win! We have big plans this year and we knew in order to achieve them; we would have to start with a solid performance on our home course.

We entered three boats in total, an 8 and to 4's. With the 8 scheduled for the first session and the 4's in the second, there was no time to waste on the turnaround.

The 8 had a fantastic race, even with the whippersnapper juniors from West London close on our heels. Molly set us off at a strong 32 down the course, and our bow pair kept the bow deck high. We took plenty away from the race including how to execute our last 500 and nailing down what calls were most effective. Overall, we came off the water feeling confident and having had a great race.

The two fours were set to be even boats, with no true A boat. As our primary focus this year is larger boats, we wanted to see how close a finish we could get together. The Saga had to overcome some equipment issues, and the Wintech had to steer away from many a dev quad. In in the end, I'm pleased to report the two fours were only three seconds apart!

In the end, the 8 was 20+ seconds faster than the next crew and only 1 second off the Vets Men's 8 and was the fastest women's boat of the regatta! It was a fantastic way to start the season, and the first time we've regained the title of fastest women's boat in quite a few years. It was fantastic to bring this title back home! The Saga 4 ended out a very close win over the second place Wintech but the victory in this race was just how even the two fours were, even with all the complications the races threw at us.



After a well-earned rest over Christmas and New Year, we're straight back into it with a series of head races coming up fast on the horizon.


